

Dr. Mary Redmayne, PhD is an Adjunct Research Fellow in the Centre for Population Health Research on Electromagnetic Energy (PRESEE) at Monash University, Melbourne, within the Department of Epidemiology and Preventive Medicine. Having completed a post-doctoral research fellowship there, she has now returned home to New Zealand, working as an independent researcher, educator and consultant, and as an adjunct research fellow at Victoria University of Wellington.
